

fractions

Fractions are a part of a whole.




The denominator, or the bottom number tells you how many parts the whole was broken into, and the numerator, the top number, tells you how many parts you have.



Here, the fraction 1/6 would describe the slice being taken out. Since the whole is divided up into six pieces, and only one slice, or part, is going to be eaten, the fraction is correct.

Fairy Tale asc order

This worksheet has your students write fairy—tale themed words in alphabetical order. It is great for homework or a center activity,

FAIRY TALE BRAINSTORM

In writing, the students can write their own fairy tales! Pass out this worksheet so that they can get their ideas down, then write a rough draft. Once you have conferenced with them, they can write their final draft on pretty paper or even in a book format!

red riding hood diary

This fun activity goes along with the story of Red Riding Hood. They write down the events of the story as a diary entry.

Point of view

Point of view is very important in all stories, but especially fairy tales. Once you have talked about point of view as a class, the students can go back to their seats and write Cinderella from the stepmother's point of view.

comparison chart

Since fairy tales share common elements, this chart will be perfect to compare the many stories. It is very easy to fill out, so no worries! :)

wanted poster

The wanted poster can be used for any villain, but I think it would be great for the wolf in The Three Little Pigs. Depending on what grade your dolls are in, they can either draw or write the thing in each category.

abjectives

It's important to teach your dollies some grammar! This adjective worksheet is for class or home.

invitation to the ball

What is better than an invitation to a ball? In this activity, the students decorate and fill out an invite to a royal ball.

SUMMARY CASTLE

The summary castle is a way to recap what your dolls read. They fill out each section, and, if you want to, color it. Cut it out and hang it up around your classroom!



Learn all about adjectives with Goldilocks and the Three Bears!



Quiz your students on their knowledge of state capitals! All they have to do is write the name of the capital next to the corresponding state.






